Have you ever noticed the statue of a boy with a book that stands near the western end of the parking area at Stanbery Park?

The monument, honoring "those who gave their service" in World War I, was moved to the present location from the original site in the "Public Park" at Beechmont and Campus when the library was built.

For several years the Mt. Washington Civic Club raised funds for the memorial and presented it to the Park Board in June, 1938.
