Washington" on June 18, 1892, the program listed these thirteen graduates; Grace Cowgill, Siddle Cochran, Edna Durham, Susie Edwards, Sadie Durham, Mary Durham, Mary Hahn and Harly Furlong of Newtown; Artemus Day, Mt. Carmel, and Laura Corbly, Jottie Kendall, Mary Lewis and Nina Rose of Mt. Washington.

Wonder why Mt. Carmel was included and the other "Township" schools were not?
