There seems to be a lingering, nagging confusion about the scope of interest of the ANDERSON TOWNSHIP Historical Society. Are we concerned about the history of California, Mt. Washington, and Newtown? Absolutely YES! - as well as Asbury, Cedar Point, Cluff, Forestville, Mercersburg, Mt. Summit, Salem, Sweetwine, Salem, Uniontown and anything else in the historic and geographic area bounded on the east by the Hamilton/Clermont County line, on the south by the Ohio river and on the northwest by the Little Miami river.

Excerpted from "Rules and Regulations of the Mt. Washington Public Schools",
Adopted March 23, 1891:

"No teacher or pupil shall be permitted to use tobacco in any form during school hours.

No pupil of the public school shall be allowed to bear firearms during school hours, and if found guilty of such offence, shall be immediately suspended by the Principal and reported to the Board.

No scholar will be allowed to throw stones, brickbats, or other injurious missiles, on the school ground, or in going to and from school.

Every scholar is required to attend school punctually and regularly, to conform to all the rules of the teachers, to be diligent in study, respectful to teachers, and kind and obliging to school-mates, and every pupil absent for five consecutive days shall be dropped from the rolls."
