ATHS COORDINATOR REPORTS ON PROGRESS

So far this year, we have had many unforeseen, unavoidable and costly expenditures. We need the support of every member in the society - in whatever manner possible.

A few of the costs are:

- 1) Basement Flooding - cost over that covered by insurance - at least \$200.
- 2) Parking Lot Flooding - Ed Motz scraped excess mud free of charge - contractor cost was \$800.
- 3) Recharging of 9 Fire Extinguishers - done every 7 years - \$190.
- 4) Grass Cutting - Due to heavy rain and increased labor costs this year's cost has been very expensive.
- 5) Roof on Cabin - \$3,900.
- 6) Estimated Repair of Logs - \$6,500.

These costs are in addition to our regular current expenses. You can see the need to raise money is here.

Since Country Store generates 90% of our income, each and every member can surely help in some way to make it a success.
