SOCIETY MAKES IMPROVEMENTS AT CABIN

In addition to purchasing a refurbished lawn mower, the society has received a second lawn mower from members Bob & Ruth Silverman. As a result, we now have two working lawnmowers on the premises for our volunteer maintenance force. The Silvermans also donated a wheel barrow to the society, as did Bill Hornschemeier.

With all this useful equipment, we only need volunteers to have lovely grounds. help out with this dollar-saving project.

In addition, many members have worked very hard to clear away the overgrown shrubery from in front of the brick house. Judy Bob Radcliffe cut down the Bradford pear tree which was damaged beyond salvation in a recent storm. Evans Landscaping hauled significant savings versus the dumpster charge) and has made a favorable bid for re-landscaping the brick house. Trustee Bob Christman has worked very hard getting recommendations and bids (in addition to physical labor on the project.

As a result, the Board has recommended the membership approve up to \$2500 for a two-phase landscaping plan. We will start with a \$1500 initial planting this fall. The Board has waived the notification rule and the membership will vote on the landscaping appropriation at the SEPT meeting.
