## LOG HOUSE FURNISHINGS

It is time to make plans for furnishings for the Log House! The memorial and honor gift fund set aside for this purpose has reached an amount that can enable us to at least make a beginning. Our funds are limited, and it will be a long time before we can acquire the things we need. Therefore, the cabin committee asks that all members scan their possessions for possible gifts to ATHS of any of the listed items. Some purchases are intended, so if you have among your belongings listed items which you would like to sell, the committee is most interested. - Large Items:
1. 4 or 5 drawer chest; blanket chest; corner cupboard, or open cupboard. (Must be under 6½ ft. high & of native wood.)
  2. Chairs, loop back Windsor (kitchen chair); wooden seat, painted & stencilled; arrowback or rod back, wooden seat; slat-back, rush seat.
  3. Chair, rocking chair Boston type; spindle back type; arrow-back type; slat back, rush seat type.
  4. Table, wooden kitchen type, 1890-1900, or drop leaf, 1890-1900. (About 3½ ft. long.)
  5. Settle; or settle table; or stretcher table, early 1800's.
  6. Working spinning or flax wheel.
  7. Cradle, early 1800's design.
- Small Items:
1. Pewterware.
  2. Butterchurn, wooden.
  3. Powder horn.
  4. Blue and white dishes.
  5. Ironstone pieces.
  6. Looking glass, wall.
